Policy Recommendation with NGO representatives

After the seminar in India we drafted a policy recommendation to submitted in the Municipality of Kozani. We have presented the policy recommendation outline to youth workers from several NGOs across the region and got useful feedback for its finalization. On the 17th of May 2023 the policy recommendation was part of discussion of the Municipality of Kozani committee and we are waiting for its integration for the sustainability plan that Kozani is preparing.

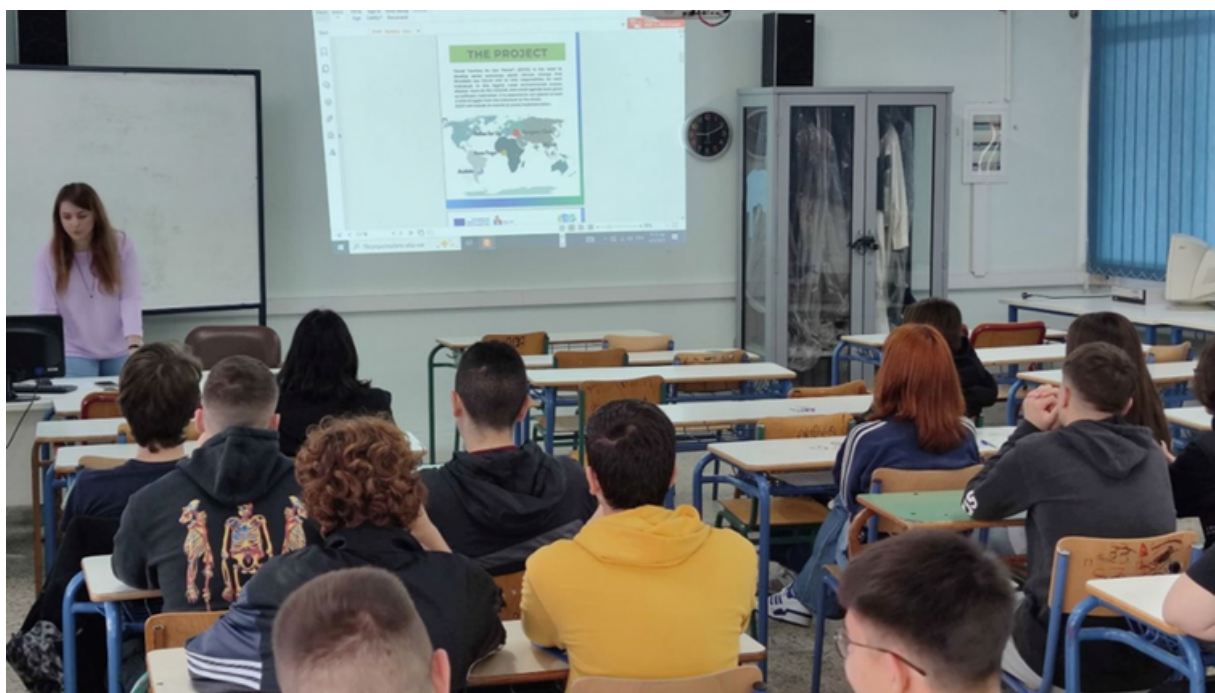
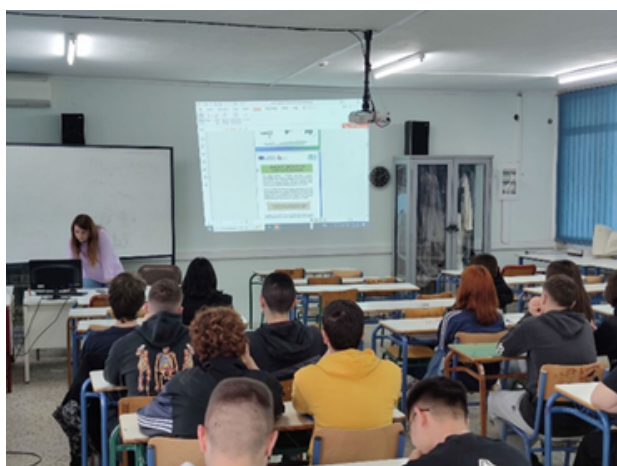


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Seminar with young people (physical presence)

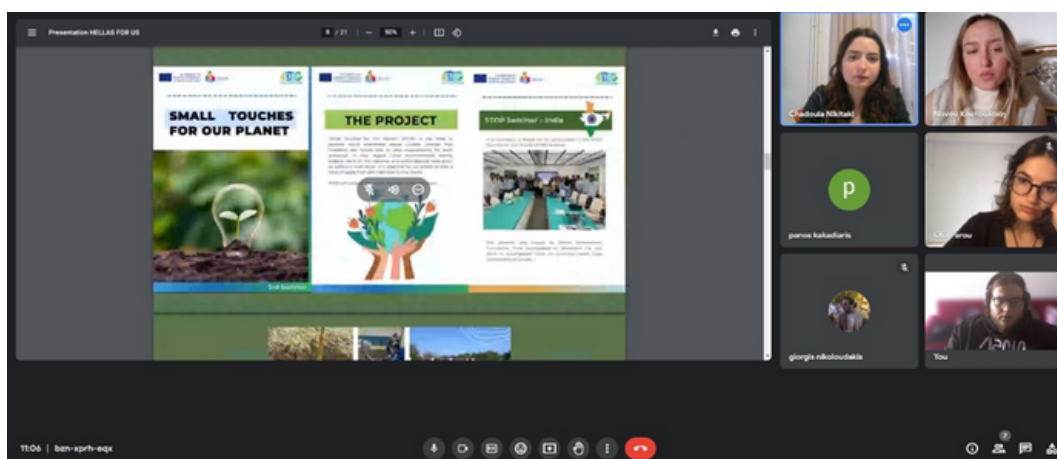
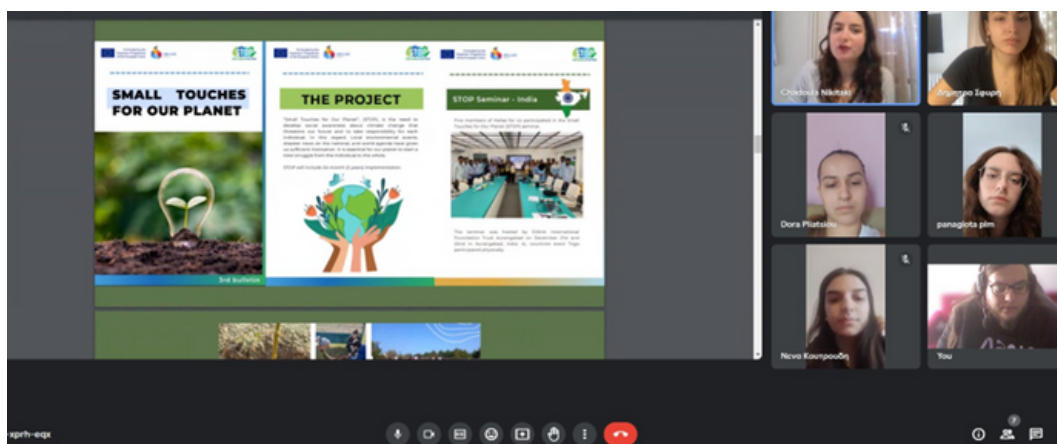
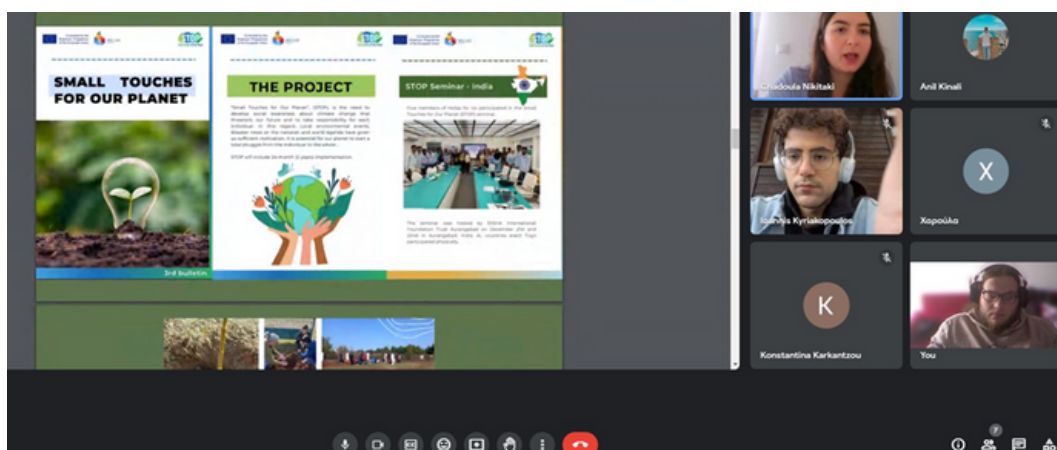


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Seminar with young people (online)
